Don't Let The 'Bad Guy' Drive, Race Expert Says

Don't let that bad guy drive the car! According to Roger Ward, winner of last year's Indianapolis "500," that "bad guy" may be your alter ego — the subconscious you that acts on your secret wishes and fears. And he's the cause of your accidents.

Whether you're on the race track or on the highway makes little difference, Ward adds. The dangerous driver is the one who blows his emotional fuses at the slightest provocation.

HE HAS both experience and psychological authority to

back him up. He has been racing professionally for almost 15 years, and cited the findings of a study of driver psychology made for the U.S. Public Health Service to back up his argument.

"The study indicated that professional drivers seldom get into trouble," Ward reported. "The trouble-maker is the driver with his mind in the clouds and his emotions in a tangle."

WARD'S CURRENT chore is that of performance steward for the 1960 Mobilgas Economy Run — a 2000-mile fuel economy test in which some 50 cars will drive from Los Angeles to

Minneapolis. "We've found that economical driving is almost always good driving," Ward says. "It's good for the same reason that race driving is good — because it's unemotional."

ACCORDING TO Ward, safe courteous driving is largely a matter of emotional makeup and social adequacy. The accident repeater or chronic traffic violator is aggressive, intolerant, irresponsible and impulsive. He has an exaggerated sense of self-importance and a grandiose estimate of his own abilities.

So whether you prefer the

scientific or the practical man's approach, the advice is the same: When you take your car out, leave your frustrations parked in the garage.

Bishop W. Maynard Sparks of the Evangelical United Brethren Church Conference will make his first official visit to Torrance Sunday when he presides over dedication services for the new educational unit of the Central Evangelical United Brethren Church here at 2:30 p.m.

Bishop Sparks, a native of Pennsylvania and the son of a minister in the Allegheny Conference, was elevated to the office of Bishop by vote of the

general conference last October and was appointed to serve the Pacific Area of the church.

Bishop Sparks was educated at the Lebanon Valley College and United Theological Seminary and took graduate work at the University of Pittsburgh's School of Theology and at Temple University in Philadelphia.

HE WAS PASTOR in western Pennsylvania from 1930 to 1946; conference superintendent until 1950, and was chaplain and assistant professor of religion at Lebanon Valley College until his appointment as a Bishop last October.

He succeeded Bishop Ira D. Warner who retired from his duties as leader of the Pacific Area of the church last year.
