These fish come in on a high incoming tide. About four or five days afterwards is when the fishing is best, on an outgoing tide. The next best time being from April 15th to the 20th. Use sardines for balt cut in four pieces.

Catfishing is also very good at nite. Take along some big gunny sacks, as I know you'll fill them up. Mr. Mata just came back from San Felipe. Didn't do himself any good, but did see several (Toutwava) caught in the seventy pound class. You can really make a trip out of it. Fish the Rio Hardie and then on to San Felipe
