### TV Hasn't Replaced Radio At This Torrance School

Although some people think TV is the coming method of instruction, teachers at Perry Elementary School are happy with the old-fashioned radio, school officials report.

There, many of the teachers use the familiar Standard

School Broadcast to supplement the regular classroom instruction. This weekly Thursday morning program presents a number of diverse facts around a central theme, and is designed for fourth to eighth grade listeners.

Since materials are sent out in advance, teachers can prepare their classes for the material they will hear over the radio and give background.

### Torrance Passes Half Way Mark For Red Cross

The Red Cross campaign in Torrance had reached 58 per cent of its goal of \$9,000 as of April 1st, it was reported by Dean Sears, local fund chairman.

Residential division stands at 82 per cent of \$4750 goal; business division has 59 per cent of its goal of \$1750; and commerce and industry division has 14 per cent of a goal of \$2500.

Sears lauded the volunteer workers in the residential division who had exceeded their division quotas. Mrs. James E. McNeill, chairman of Waleria division, leads with 270 per cent of quota of \$216; Mrs. C. L. Jackson, chairman of western section of North Torrance, has 125 per cent of quota of \$140; Mrs. Kenny Uyeda, chairman of eastern section of North Torrance, has 121 per cent of quota of \$254; and Mrs. Helen Lackey, chairman of Central Torrance, has 113 per cent of quota of \$947.

Sears added the southern region goal of \$44,500 now stands at 82 per cent of quota, and the chapter goal of \$3,316,468, stands at 65 per cent of quota.

The chairman appealed to all citizens who had not yet contributed or been personally contacted by a volunteer worker to respond to the fund drive by mailing in their donations to the Red Cross office, 1110 Sartori.

He added that if Red Cross is to continue its many services to the communities, it is vital that its \$3.3 million goal be reached.
