

# Annual African Violet Show Slated April 22

"Hawaiian Holiday" is the theme for the seventh annual African Violet show which opens to the public on April 22 and 23 at the Professional Women's Clubhouse, 820 Java Street, one block east of South La Brea near Arbor Vitae St., Inglewood. The event will be staged by the Inglewood Chapter of the African Violet Society of America.

The Hawaiian atmosphere will dominate this colorful show. Overlooking the auditorium from a stage at one

end, will be a large scene of the islands, beach, surf, and palm trees. In a setting of tropical foliage a mannequin of a Hawaiian dancer, in native garb, will beckon aloha to visitors.

In this motif, each show officer and hostess will be dressed in the native island fashion, in Muu Muu and lei, and the traditional hibiscus blossom as hair adornment.

Many novel ideas will be used in displaying plants. Oriental burlap sacking will cover each display table,

while a miniature palm tree will stand in the center. Pastel blue plant labels, studded with sea-shells and colored sand, will identify each plant.

New varieties of African violets, on display for the first time, will be a feature of the show. Hundreds of outstanding plants, selected for perfection of form and color of blooms, will be exhibited so that visitors will have an opportunity to see the best African violets.

A special attraction will be a courtesy exhibit by Mrs.

Clarissa Harris, hybridizer.

Mrs. Cecil Houdyshel, commercial grower of La Verne, California, will show many of her blooming African violets.

Both Mrs. Harris and Mrs. Houdyshel will answer questions on violet culture.

Choice plants and hard-to-find varieties of African violets will be on sale.
