

# Come to Church for **EASTER SERVICES**

## Narbonne Ave. Baptists Plan Dual Services

The Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church will have two Easter services with the Adult Choir bringing special Easter music at both 8:30 a.m. and 10:50 a.m.

The pastor, Robert A. Wells, will bring "The Easter Message" at both services. "That we may know what the resurrection means to us, I want to proclaim the glad news, 'Christ arose from the dead.' He gave his life but took it up again. This was the greatest victory of all time," Mr. Wells stated.

The Adult Choir will present an Easter Cantata at the 7:30 p.m. worship service. This is an annual event that attracts widespread attention.

The cantata is "Hallelujah! What a Saviour." This is a cantata based on familiar hymns depicting the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. The choir will be under the direction of Edwin T. Isbell, minister of music at the local church. The public is invited. No charge will be made.

Three of the local church choirs will be a part of a 400-voice choir that will present an Easter Festival of Music in the Long Beach Auditorium on Friday at 8 p.m. The joint choirs will be directed by an instructor from the Southern California University, Leslie Thompson.
