

## School TV Still Has Many Bugs

Educational TV may be a great teaching tool of the future, but it has many "bugs" to be worked out.

That was the gist of a preliminary report made recently to the Torrance Board of Education. Five schools have tried out television in various types of instruction during the past year, using Los Angeles County programs. Sets were used at Riviera and Casimir Elementary Schools and at North, South, and Torrance High Schools.

"Open Circuit" TV of the type tried here has not been too satisfactory because it generally fits neither the curriculum nor the time schedule of local classes, it was indicated.

Teachers indicated that "Closed circuit" programs, designed more specifically for local classes, and viewing of special events might well be worthwhile uses of the TV programs. They indicated interest in seeing other types of programming.
