## Harbor Freeway Extension To Be Opened on May 2nd

Contractor on the Harbor Freeway extension has now scheduled May 2 as the date for opening of the northbound lanes only, between Alondra Blvd. (181st St.) and the present end of the freeway at 124th St., it was announced yesterday.

In anticipation of the early opening of the freeway, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn this week joined with local officials in inspecting work being done to improve major roads which will feed traffic into the new freeway section.

Work being done in the area where the freeway will be opened includes improvement of both Broadway and Alondra Blvd. so that this main intersection will have an increased traffic capacity. The improvement of this intersection was mapped out by Supervisor Hahn and County Road Commissioner N. H. Templin on a similar inspection tour last month. Alondra has been widened between Figueroa and Broadway.

THOSE IN THE inspection party included Mayor Adams Bolton of Gardena, Mayor D.M. Clawson of Compton, Councilman John S. Gibson Jr., of Los Angeles, and Charles Welton, secretary-manager, Gardena Gardena Valley chamber of commerce.

OPENING OF THE southbound lanes on the freeway to Alondra Blvd. will be delayed about two weeks after the northbound lanes have been opened. Only limited traffic will be able to use the southbound lanes until the temporary off-ramp at 124th St., now the end of the freeway, has

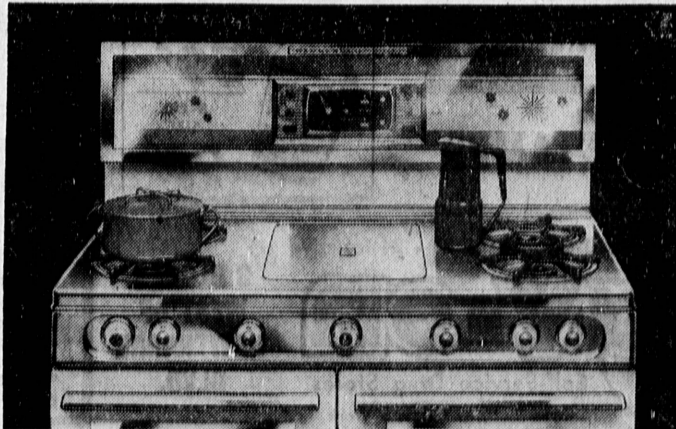
