Goodwill Tour Of Mexico Set For June-July

A 16-day "Goodwill Tour" of Old Mexico will be sponsored by the Torrance Chamber of Commerce June 24 through July 9, it was announced today by President J. H. Paget.

Paget said that the first Chamber-sponsored trip to Mexico in 1958 was so popular that the return trip was planned. In 1959 an "Hawaiian Holiday Tour" was held.

Arrangements have been made through the Mercury Travel Service for the tour, which is offered at the low-package price of \$387 per person, including air fare, via Western Air Lines to Mexico City and return.

Also included are all hotel accommodations, in first-class hotels, 10 luncheons, eight dinners, and all fees for entrances to sight-seeing places.

Overnight stops, in addition to Mexico City (6 days) are Acapulco (3 days) Taxico (2 days), Tehuacan (3 days). Famous places visited include: Xochimilco, Pyramids, Chapinigo, Santana, Tlaxcala, Huejotzingo, Colonial Puebla, Cholula, Forten, Orizaba, Cordoba, Los Reyes, San Martin Texmelucan, Cuernavaca, Vista Hermosa, and many parks, museums, castles, shrines, and churches.

Chamber officials said that this is the first trip the Chamber has sponsored in June and July. The change was made to accommodate more people who requested a summer vacation trip, especially school teachers.

God's infinite mercy and goodness will be brought out in the Lesson-Sermon entitled "Everlasting Punishment" at all Christian Science services Sunday.


