**Halldale Plans More Hearings
Dance Festival On Gas Co. Bid
To Observe Week To Up Rates Set**

In observance of Public Schools Week the pupils and faculty of Halldale Avenue School will present their annual spring dance festival Friday, April 29th. This year's theme is County Fair and will be carried out in appropriate costuming and dances.

The dance festival will begin at 9:45 a.m. and will be opened with special greetings to parents and friends by Mrs. Judson Bowers, president of the Halldale P.T.A. Mrs. Amanda Wilhelm, principal, will also welcome the visitors on behalf of the students and faculty.

Mrs. Elizabeth Hampel and Mrs. Mary Halvorsen have been in charge of arrangements assisted by other members of the faculty and custodial service.

This event is always one of the highlights of the year for both students and parents and is one of the very colorful events at Halldale.

The State Public Utilities Commission is holding further hearings this week in Los Angeles on the application of Southern California Gas Company for authority to increase rates. Commissioner Peter E. Mitchell and Examiner William W. Dunlop will preside at 10 a.m. in the Commission courtroom at 145 South Spring St.

This series of hearings will be devoted principally to cross-examination of company witnesses who testified last month in support of the request. According to company witnesses, the proposed increase, if authorized, would add about 80 cents to the monthly bill of the typical residential customer. The increase is necessary, they testified, to offset rising operating costs, including the price of natural gas supplies.

Hearings have been scheduled for May 18, 19 and 20, when all interested parties will be given an opportunity to present evidence. Public Utilities Commission auditors and engineers will present the results of their independent investigation of the company's financial condition and operations at hearings in June.

Southern California Gas Company serves about 1,660,000 customers in Fresno, Imperial, Kern, Kings, Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Tulare Counties.
