Minckler Leaves Mobil Oil After 36-Year Career

The retirement of M. L. Minckler as senior vice president of Mobil Oil Co. which was announced earlier this was announced earlier this year, became effective May 1. He was president of General Petroleum Corp. from 1948 until Jan. 1 when it merged with other operations of Socony Mobil Oil Co. into one

cony Mobil Oil Co. into one nation wide operating firm, Mobil Oil Co.

Herbert Willetts, president of Mobil Oil Co., said Minckler. had declined a high executive position with the company in New York because of his many important community activities in the West.

MINCKLER JOINED General Petroleum in 1924 as an accountant. He was made assistant to the president 10 years after joining the company. He was elected a director in 1941, a vice president in 1945, and executive vice president in president in executive vice president in 1947 and president in 1948.

During the first World War, During the IIrst World War, Minckler served in the Army. During World War II, he was Director of Petroleum Supply of the Petroleum Administra-tion for War, with headquar-ters in Washington, D.C.

MINCKLER'S oil industry activities includes serving as a director of the Western Oil and Gas Assn. and the American Petroleum Institute. He is a member of the Board of Governors of the Pacific Oil Institute.

Minckler is a trustee of the California Institute of Technol-ogy and consulting professor of business management at the Graduate School of Business, Stanford University, and a member of the Advisory Board of the Hoover Institution on War, Revolution and Peace.

HE IS A senior board member and a trustee of the National Industrial Conference Board, a vice president and director of the California State Chamber of Commerce, president and director of the Welfare Federation of the Los Angeles area. He is also a director of the Investment Company of America and of the Pacific Indemnity Co.

Coffee added that "The amount of money spent is the least important factor in determining the quality of education." He pointed out that citizens must never give up the zens must never give up the right to direct the type of schooling their children will

receive.
"We should never use the wrong means to achieve the desired ends, no matter how desirable they seems to be. The ultimate cost is played down," he went on, "since federal aid is like 'small down payment' advertising"." advertising."
