

Mobile Red Cross Canteen In Parade Here Saturday

One of the features of the Armed Forces Day parade in Torrance on Saturday, May 21, will be the American Red Cross "mobile disaster canteen."

Taking its place among a wide variety of national defense equipment used in military service, the Red Cross "disaster unit" will represent the community's awareness of the importance of civil defense.

The disaster canteen, a gift of the AFL-CIO, is a vital part of the Red Cross blueprint for emergency preparedness. It is designed to be driven by a volunteer member of the motor service and manned by volunteer canteen workers.

"THE MOBILE canteen is used frequently by Red Cross whenever there is need for emergency feeding," explained

Mrs. Robert Orainé, volunteer disaster chairman for Torrance. Completely stocked at all times to serve 500 persons, the big white truck with the familiar Red Cross is available to all areas covered by the Los Angeles Chapter.

INCLUDED IN the equipment carried by the mobile kitchen are a butane stove, a refrigerator, stretcher, all necessary cooking utensils, as well as 70 gallons of drinking water.

It is constructed so that canteen workers may start serving within minutes after arrival at the scene of a disaster.

Crowds who attend the Armed Forces Day parade will have an opportunity to inspect the "disaster unit" at first hand when it is put on display with other parade equipment following the 11 a.m. march.

Summer Camp for Blind Children Now Taking Applications Here

Applications are now being accepted for Camp Bloomfield, only summer camp for blind children in the entire Southwestern United States, which will open July 2nd and continue to Sept. 1st, it was announced today by Norman Kaplan, executive director of the Foundation of the Junior Blind, the non-profit corporation which operates the camp located in the Malibu Mountains, 20 miles north of Los Angeles.

"We welcome all blind and partially sighted youngsters between the ages of 6 and 21, regardless of race, creed or color, at Camp Bloomfield," Kaplan said.

"THERE IS NO fee charged to the children, interested individuals and organizations contribute the necessary funds which operate the camp."

Swimming, hiking, fishing, boating, baseball — all the activities usually associated with "seeing" camps are participated in by the children at Camp Bloomfield.

"To be able to do all the things which sighted children do instills a great deal of self-confidence in the blind boy or girl," Kaplan stated.
