Water Tiff With Lomita Nearing End

An adequate water supply for beleaguered residents of 356 acres of Lomita and Torrance properties seemed assured this week when the County Board of Supervisors ordered condemnation of the Narbonne Ranch Water Company No. 2 by County Waterworks District No. 13.

After acquiring the private company, the County will refurbish the system which is new so deficient that building permits are denied applicants in the area and the financing of subdivision development has been withdrawn.

ON JAN. 5th, this year an election was held within the territory seeking annexation to District No. 13 of 268 acres of unincorporated territory and 88 acres within the City of Torrance.

In the course of the proceedings the City of Torrance filed two suits to prevent the election and to condemn the water company. Another suit was filed by a property owner.

approved a compromise agreement to withdraw the lawsuits under certain conditions, thus opening the door for the Board of Supervisors to proceed with the acquisition of the water system.

Terms of the city-county agreement provide that the Board must acquire the present system, and sell the \$600,000 improvement bonds. The system will then be constructed to County and Torrance city standards.

FOLLOWING completion of the work, the portion of the system within Torrance will be leased to the city.

In the area seeking annexation to District No. 13, the votes cast favoring the proposal were 446 "Yes" and 125 "No." In the existing district the votes cast on proposition of accepting the new area for annexation were 420 "Yes" and 70 "No."
