The kids will go for the water skiing too. Nacimiento Dam and Santa Marguerita Lake are still reporting good bass and blue gill fishing. Cachuma Lake is an ideal vacation and fishing spot. If it's Stripped Bass, anywhere in the Delta region, up Stockton way. Every bait is a nibble. Be sure and let it run good before setting the hook.

If it's Salmon you're after go to any of the rivers in northern Calif. The Rogue and mouth of the Klamath are the best spots. If you don't want to travel that far, Monterey is always good for salmon fishing, also the San Francisco Bay area. But, if you fish in the ocean, use three-to-four pound sinkers. It's clamming, go to Pismo Beach or any place below the border. There will be minus tides Monday thru Sunday of next week in the early morning.

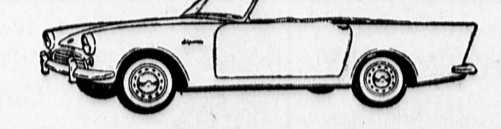

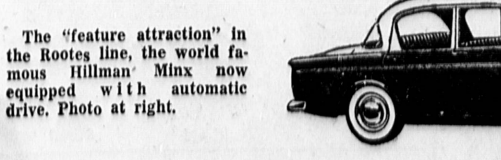
