Councilman Jack Belasco of Hermosa Beach has endorsed the re-election of Charles D Barker as director of the Cen tral and West Basin Water Re-plenishment District in the election to be held next Tuesday, June 7th. Last week Belasco announc-ed his support of Barker. Last

November Belasco was Bark-er's opponent for the same of-fice. At that time Barker was elected and has since served as director and secretary. Bar-ker has long worked effectively with water problems of the West Basin as director of the West Basin Water Assn.

ELECTED TO the board of newly formed Replenishment District in November, Barker drew a short term at the new board's formation meeting and he is now standing for election for a full four-year term.

To obtain continuity of di-rection and management of a district, the law requires, after a simultaneous election of all a simultaneous election of all five directors upon the forma-tion of a new district, that no more than three director's terms shall expire at one time. This is accomplished by draw-ing lots at the first board meet-ing . . .
