7500 Enroll For Summer School Here Some 7500 students have signed up for summer school classes in Torrance schools, according to Mrs. Trudy Aldershof, director. These include some 7000 elementary students and 2500 in high schools. The high school figures include 1475 eighth graders who will be doing work in exploratory or advanced courses. The eighth grade program is designed to help students take more subjects. High school enrollment is up from last year by about 500 students. Classes will be held for six weeks, from June 20 to July 29, in all buildings. High school classes will be offered in all subjects for which there is enough demand.
