

Methodist to Consider Study on Property Taxes During Conclave

Findings from a two-year study on whether churches should accept or refuse property tax exemption from the state will be presented during the 110th session of the Southern California-Arizona Methodist Conference at the University of Redlands, June 13-18.

Prepared by a 13-member committee, the study was ordered by the 1958 session as a result of debate on California's Proposition 13 to repeal tax exemption for private and parochial school property un-

der the college level. Voters defeated repeal by 1,760,707 votes.

THE STUDY will go into the possibility of progressive church disengagement from tax exempt status, looking into

legal, economic, and religious implications.

More than 1,000 ministers and laymen, representing 403 churches throughout Southern California and Arizona, will attend the week-long meeting.

Bishop Gerald Kennedy, Los Angeles, who was installed in April as president of the denomination's Council of Bishops, will preside.

GUEST SPEAKER at four evening worship services will be Dr. Robert J. McCracken, since 1946 minister of Riverside Church, New York City. His topics: "Jesus and Status Seeking," "Isn't Religion Old Stuff? Hasn't Science Outmoded It?" "The Real Opiate of the Masses," and "On Hating Things, Not People."

Dr. McCracken, a native of Scotland, received his education at the University of Glasgow and Cambridge. He began his ministry in the Marshall Street Baptist Church in Edinburgh in 1928. Ten years later he went to Canada as associate professor of Christian theology and philosophy of religion at McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario. By 1944 he had risen to head of the department. He is author of two books, a preacher on the National Radio Pulpit, and recipient of 12 honorary degrees.

DELEGATES and visitors to Redlands also will hear reports on plans for a \$2.5 million fund campaign for new churches and California Western University, San Diego, and from 42 boards, agencies and institutions of the Conference. Education leaders are expected to bring in blueprints for 1960-61 project to place more full-time ministers on state and independent college and university campuses. One recommendation will be to create a permanent Commission on Christian Higher Education.

OTHER DECISIONS facing delegates:

1. Budgets totaling more than \$2.3 million for benevolences, ministerial support and administration, interdenominational work, and special cause quotas.
2. Fifteen resolutions from the Board of Christian Social Concerns on issues ranging from world peace to narcotics.
3. A recommendation to investigate the possibility of adding new districts (geographic units) to the seven now comprising the Southern California-Arizona Conference.
