## Gentlemen:

On July 2, 1958, the Board of Education sent a letter to the City Council listing some facts and responsibilities pertaining to new housing. At that time we told you that about 50 per cent of the cost of education comes from local taxes and that it cost at that time \$335 to educate a pupil per year. Two elementary schools, together with site costs at present rates can easily exceed \$1,000,000 in capital outlay.

The Planning Commission and the City Council saw fit to go ahead with the housing projects referred to. We are now in a position of attempting to find proper procedures for financing new schools.

In addition to the problem of housing the students, the problem of financing them at the current rate of \$357 per pupil and the increased rate, which will approach \$400 per pupil next year will require a 50 cents override tax in 1961-62. This is why the Board of Education requested your support on the coming tax increase election.

We would like further to call to your attention the fact that an individual house as typically built in Torrance produces usually less than 150 per house per year for education in Torrance, and many of these houses have two or three and even four pupils to educate. At the projected rate of 400 a pupil, it is easy to see that these houses are a burden to the property

An increasing problem that is facing the Board of Education is the fact that the school dollar is only financed now about 45 per cent by the State and about 55 per cent by the local district. In other words, the local property owners' share of the support of education is increasing.

Since the houses do not produce enough revenue to pay for the education of the children they produce by a good many times, it is essential that no more land which is now zoned manufacturing be converted to residential zoning unless you wish to increase the local property tax to finance the education of additional children as well as other city services.

The Board is fully aware of the fact that there are financial pressures that have more to do with some of these decisions than does the power and authority of the Council. However, a resistive attitude on the part of the Council to rezoning would result in a slower rate of development of the problem and would be beneficial from the point of view of services that have to be rendered by both the Council and the Board of Education,
