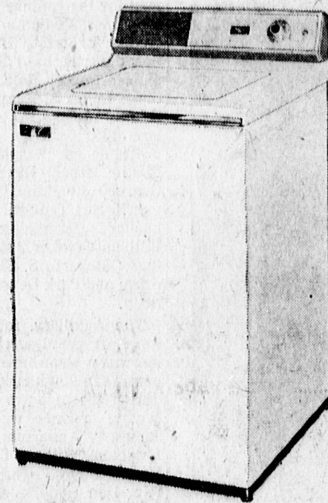
Auxiliary Will Stage Hawaiian Luau June 28

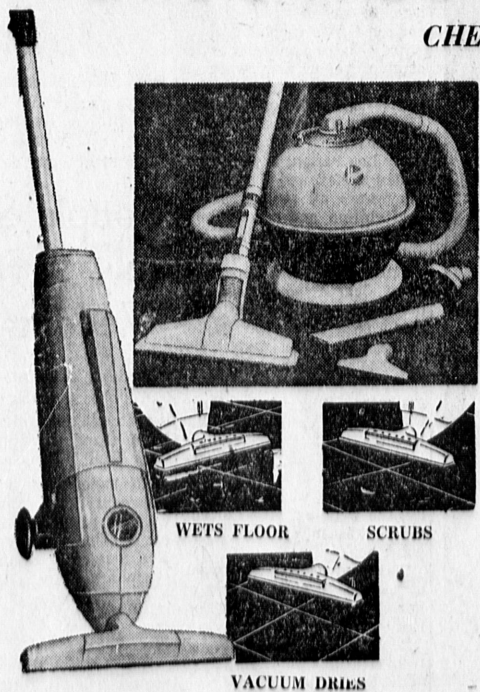
