## Important Gains in Battle Against Cancer Reviewed

Man has learned more about cancer in the past decade and a half than he learned in all of the thousands of years before, according to Dr. Sal Baker, president of the Los Angeles County Branch of the American Cancer Society.

He credited the Society for the impetus which has been given to cancer research in recent years, and urged generous public support of its 1960 fund raising appeal.

"In 1946, when the Society began its pioneer program of grants to encourage cancer research and support the training of new cancer researchers, the scientific climate was cold," Dr. Baker said.

"SCIENTISTS shared the popular view that cancer was a hopeless problem, and they were reluctant to waste their talents in such unpromising work. But with the support and encouragement which the Society was able to provide, more and more top flight researchers entered the field until today the attack against cancer is the greatest ever launched against any disease." Because cancer is a wild and unexplainable multiplication of cells, the first target of research has been the cell itself, according to Dr. Baker.

DURING THE past few years, he pointed out:

1. Biochemists have developed amazing new insights into the complex chemical reactions of cells. The complicated structures of molecules have been unraveled, and unbelievably sensitive tests have been evolved for detecting cellular activity.

2. The patterns of cell chemistry have been traced with the help of radioactive isotopes, and previously unseen structures of the cell have been magnified more than 100,000 times with the help of the electron microscope.

3. TECHNIQUES of cell surgery have been refined to such

an extent that the nucleus of one cell can be transplanted into another, and cell parts can be lifted out for detailed study.

4. An intricate process of taking apart molecules also has been developed to permit investigation of the possible causes of cancer.

5. **BIOCHEMISTS** have learned to predict whether or not certain molecules might cause cancer and they have created man-made molecules which are effective against cancer cells.

Their problem now is how to use them to destroy cancer cells without also injuring normal cells.

Basic cell research also has stimulated other lines of cancer inquiry, according to Dr. Baker. These include endocrinology, immunology, and virology—the latest and, according to some scientists, one of the most promising of all.

"WE HOPE that the first 15 years will prove to have been the hardest," Dr. Baker declared, "because today the ground work has been laid and cancer research is really on its way."

"What's needed now is money to equip the laborator-

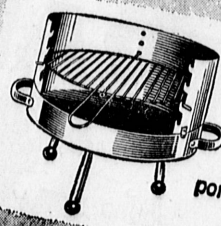

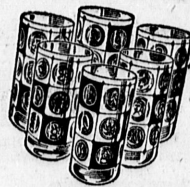

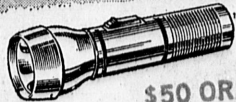
