Three Pilots Making Tenth Powder Derby

Three women will be participating in their Tenth All-Woman Transcontinental Air Race when they take off from Torrance Municipal Airport on Saturday, July 9th for Wilmington, Del.
 The 1960 event, usually called the Powder Puff Derby, will be the Fourteenth Edition of the Nation's number one Transcontinental Air Race. Eighty-five planes are entered in the race, smashing the old record of 69 in 1958.
 Mrs. Iris C. Critchell, Palos Verdes Estates, Mrs. Frances S. Bera, Long Beach and Miss Helen Greinke, Bloomington, Ill., will each be flying in the classic for the tenth time.
 Pilots competing in their ninth event are Mrs. Darline Sanders, Santee, Calif., and Mrs. Gene S. Richardson, Yakima, Wash.
 Flying their eighth race are Mrs. Alice Roberts, Phoenix; Mrs. Pauline Glasson, Corpus Christi, Texas, and Mrs. Patricia Gladney, Los Altos.
 The start is sponsored by the Long Beach Chapter, Ninety-Nines Inc. (International licensed women pilot organization), the City of Torrance and the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. Host general chairman is Torrance Airport Commissioner Joe M. Doss.

California Pilots Lead Derby List

Sixty-eight women pilots will vie with 99 from 23 other states in the 14th edition of the All-Woman Transcontinental Air Race, affectionately dubbed "Powder Puff Derby" by newsmen. The Race will start at the Torrance Municipal Airport at 9 a.m. on Saturday, July 9 and end at Wilmington, Del., on July 13th.
 Arizona and Michigan with 13 and 12 are runners-up for the number of pilots, followed by Illinois nine, Missouri, Texas and Indiana eight.
 Other states represented are Washington six, New York five, Idaho, Tennessee, Ohio and Pennsylvania four, New Jersey, Iowa, Kansas and South Carolina three; New Mexico, Colorado, Wisconsin, Nevada, and Alabama two, Alaska, and Washington, D.C., each have one representative.

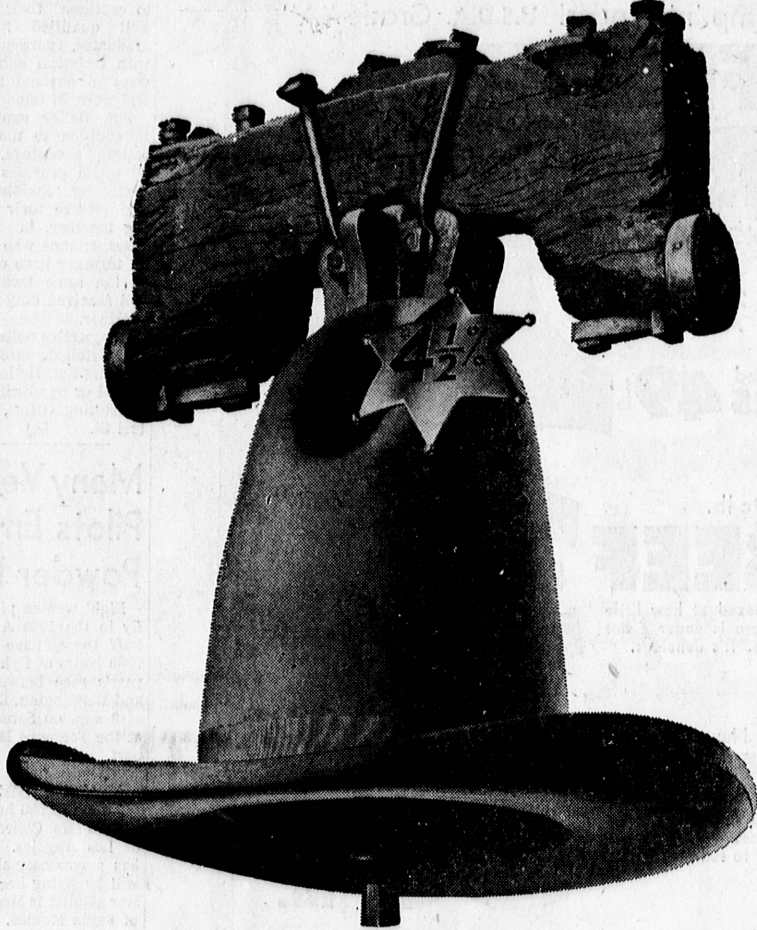
