





New Trading Stamp Laws Provide Protection to Savers, Solon Says

stamp practices became effec-tive on July 1, when the new fiscal year began.

The new regulatory provisions now in effect were contained in two separate bills, and at the time they were being considered, my office received a great many letters from housewives who saved the stamps themselves and were fearful that the practice might be too closely restricted or be too closely restricted or abolished altogether.

AS IT turned out, these fears were groundless, since the new regulations actually provide greater protection for stamp savers from unsound or mismanaged operations in the trading stamp field.

Trading stamp companies must now be licensed by the Corporations Commission, and to obtain a license they must post a bond ranging from \$25,000 to \$100,000, depending upon the annual volume of their business. to obtain a license they must post a bond ranging from \$25, 000 to \$100,000, depending upon the annual volume of their business.

SHOULD A TRADING stamp company default in the redemption of its stamps, the Commissioner may file a claim against the company and its

State Senator
Legislation enacted by the 1959 Legislature to provide the company must redeem its closer regulation of trading goods in merchandise or cassle at the option of the holder, and the Commissioner is empowerto suspend or revoke licens es after a public hearing.

> THE NAME of the trading stamp firm issuing stamps must be printed on each stamp, along with their cash-redemption value in cents, mills or fractions. Stamps presented for redemption in cassh must have an aggregate value of at least

> a dollar.

> A merchant proposing to discontinue the use of stamps is required to post a notice to that effect prominently display-ed in every place where stamps are issued.

> NO TRADING stamp company may stop issuing stamps without giving 90 days' notice to the Corporation Commission-er and to each merchant in the
