

Oceanic Conditions Predict Hot Albacore Year for Sea Anglers

Party boat fishermen have already had their first crack in nearly two years at swift-moving albacore and may get a few more cracks—if oceanic conditions hold up.

That's the opinion of the experts in the Department of Fish and Game's Marine Resources Operations, headquartered at Terminal Island.

A FEW albacore were caught near San Clemente Island by June 22, and by the end of last week more than 500 had been recorded by party boat fishermen. The fish were taken between 10 and 40 miles off San Clemente Island at the extreme outer range of the sport fleet and right where the department figured they would be.

While the initial success off San Clemente is no guarantee of a good albacore season in 1960, the department has reason to believe the early catches may herald a return to the good days of the recent past.

Fisheries scientists concluded that local conditions seem more suitable than they have for the last several years for the fish to move relatively close to shore as the season progresses and come within range of the party boat fishermen.

He tells us he was trolling a Bear Valley spinner, trailing red worms, behind a bait casting outfit for rainbow, when all of a sudden it hit. It took him 45 minutes to land and when he saw the size, he thought he must have been ocean fishing. Yet there were the trees, mountains and lots fresh air, so he knew he was not dreaming.

When he brought it into the store to show us and everyone went, "Ape," with a twinkle in his eye, he nonchalantly said, "What's all the excitement about. Hasn't anyone ever seen a fish before. You're all acting like the people in Utah. After I caught it, I put it in the back of my jeep (head sticking out one end and the tail the other) and I was almost mobbed. Never saw such excitement. Can't figure it out." Hm mmmmmmm.

Dr. Harvie, along with a lot of awed, envious folks, we offer you our congratulations after the taxidermist is through with it, may we put it in our window for all to see?

Heavy Albacore Dominate Qualifying Round at Diego

SAN DIEGO, July 7—With just two weeks remaining in the second of three eight-week periods of the \$25,000 San Diego Yellowtail Derby, heavy albacore still are dominating the qualifying round for the second major fishoff on July 22, but yellows are threatening to climb on the bandwagon.

Yellows showed up at the Coronado Islands in big schools over the weekend, but still had not settled down and were hard to hook.

Current pacesetter in the albacore-tuna section of the qualifying round is C. E. Critton, Huntington Beach, with his 32-pound 10-ounce longfin.

Rough water limited albacore catches somewhat last weekend, but one catch of 97 albies made by the Polaris near the Sixty Mile bank southwest of the Coronados stood out.

Undercover wardens nab six for Carmel River overlimits

Undercover work by state game wardens recently resulted in the arrest of six Monterey area men for taking overlimits of planted trout in the Carmel river.

The men were fined \$50 apiece and given suspended 10-day jail sentences.

Four of the men had more than 20 fish in their possession, and two of the four had 27 fish apiece.

The statewide trout limit is 10 fish.
