Garden Checklist

By the California Association of Nurserymen

 A good list of vegetables can be planted now for fall, many of them as easy-to-transplant seedlings from nursery flats.

2. Give Azaleas and Camellias another feeding of acid food if it has been over a month since the last feeding.

3. How often should you spray roses? For mildew, before it shows up-for aphis and other pests, the day they do, say most nurserymen. Some rosarians follow a weekly spray program.

4. Begonias are shade plants, but don't overdo it. Deep, dense shade makes for spindly, lacklustre plants that often drop their buds.

5. Spiking a shabby and compacted lawn usually makes all the difference. And spiking is easiest with modern equipment. Ask your nurseryman
