Harold Frentz Will Head 1960 **Community Chest Fund Drive**

Harold G. Frentz is going after another 100 per cent Torrance Community Chest campaign this year.

Jim Becker, Harbor Area Community Chest chairman, announced this week that Frentz, who headed last year's successful drive, has again accepted the top post of the Torrance appeal. Only Gardena and Harbor City-Lomita joined Torrance in the 100 per cent class last year.
