Ella Hay Schedules Lecture

Freedom from fear, sickness, and sin through spiritual understanding of God will be the topic of a free lecture on Christian Science in Rolling Hills next Sunday by Ella H. Hay of Indianapolis, Indiana.

NOW ON extensive lecture tour, Mrs. Hay will speak under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist of Palos Verdes Estates in Dapplegray Public School, Palos Verdes Dr., North, between Narbonne and Rolling Hills Rd., at 3 p.m. Her subject will be "Christian Science: Satisfaction through Utilization of Divine Power." Local members of the church have invited the public to attend. The lecture is free and no collection will be taken.

PRIOR TO entering the public practice of Christian Science healing in 1942, Mrs. Hay was active in education.

An author of a number of school textbooks, work books, and other books for children, among these, "A Child's Life of Mary Baker Eddy," she held prominent positions in the National Education Assn., the American Association for Childhood Education, and various women's clubs.

SHE IS A member of the Author's League of America and is listed as author, educator, and lecturer in "Who's Who of American Women."

Since 1953 she has lectured on Christian Science before public audiences throughout the United States, Canada, and other countries.

Calvary Men's Club To Hold Zamperini Night

The Men's Fellowship of the Calvary Baptist Church, 2818 Manhattan Beach Blvd., is sponsoring a 'Zamperini Night' for its next meeting Tuesday, July 26th. The occasion will begin with an old-fashioned family pot luck dinner at 6:15 p.m., after which the well known World War II hero and athlete will relate some of his thrilling experiences. The war experience of Capt. Louis Zamperini

was recognized by the U.S. Air Force Public Relations Dept., as one of the best and most exciting stories to come out of World War II.

Zamperini was an Olympic track star and the world's champion miler. While attending the University of Southern California, he broke the National Collegiate Mile record and held it for 15 years.

IT WAS during the 1936 Olympics in Berlin that he almost created in international incident when he tore down the Swastika from in front of Hitler's Chancellery.

During World War II he was better known as the Army Air Force Capt. who crashed at sea and spent 47 days adrift on a small rubber life raft (longest in the history of the Armed Forces) and 2½ years a POW in Japan. In a starving condition he was forced to compete against well fed Japanese runners.

HE WAS featured on Ralph Edwards "This Is Your Life" TV show. His currently popular book "Devil at My Heels" was released by Dutton of New York. It was selected for the archives of the Imperial War Museum of London.
