From the Hollywood Juvenile last year came Warfare, Tompion, who was to become the favorite this year for both the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont Stakes, and such other outstanding stakes performers as Noble Noor, New Policy, Echoic and T. V. Lark.

NOBLE NOOR was the sur-NOBLE NOOR was the surprise \$60-for \$2 winner of the Hollywood Juvenile last year, earning a net \$117,700 for his owners, Dr. and Mrs. J. R. Smith, and an additional \$11,885 for them in the breeders' awards. Tompion and Warfare, who were destined to go on to major stakes conquests in the east, were fast-closing second and third.

Two years ago the Starlet Stakes, which preceded the Hollywood Juvenile as Hollywood Park's two-year-old championship race, produced the winner Tomy Lee, who went on the following year to defeat Sword Dancer for the Kentucky Derby crown.

Consequently, when Hollypark's top-ranking two-year-olds go to the post in its season's grand finale for this division, turf experts have reason to expect a new champion or champions to be revealed.

EXPECTED TO BE the "big horses" of the 1960 Hollywood Juvenile are Rex Ellsworth's Olden Times, Mr. and Mrs. Grover D. King's Pappa's All, Covert Ranch's Saber Charge and Alberta Ranch's Big Smoky, but at least four other excellent prospects will be in the hunt for the huge pot.

Off the four straight victories of his short career, all of them scored at Hollywood Park, and his recent half-length defeat of Pappa's All, Olden Times, the French-bred son of Relic, may rank a slight favor-

Pappa's All, however, with five straight wins including two stakes at Bay Meadows, before losing to Olden Times, will have many enthusiastic backers who feel that he can reverse the decision on the Ellsworth colt the next time out.


