## Engle Urges Passage of Senate Bill Extending Public Law 874

Prompt passage of legislation extending the Federal program of aid to schools educating children whose parents live or work on tax-free Federal property has been urged by Senator Clair Engle (D-Calif.).

The California legislator is co-author of S 2393, a bill reported by the Senate labor committee which would extend for one year existing aid programs under public laws 874 and 815.

"CALIFORNIA has an enormous stake in these programs; over 600 of our school districts have been receiving payments for operating expenses and school construction under these laws," he said in a Senate speech Aug. 11.

Senator Engle said passage of S 2393 is imperative if California school districts are to be able to go ahead with plans for the school year opening next month.

Both public laws 874 and 815 terminated this year and would be ended unless renewed by this Congress.

## Ryan Electronics Inks Rich Pact

A \$2 million contract has been awarded Ryan Electronics by Hughes Aircraft Co. for the design, development, and fabrication of radar altimeter and Doppler velocity sensor equipments for NASA's Surveyor lunar soft landing vehicle. The award of the space electronics contract was announced today by T. Claude Ryan, president of Ryan Aeronautical Co., San Diego.

The Surveyor spacecraft is being developed by Hughes under a contract from the Jet Propulsion Laboratory of the California Institute of Technology. It is the second of a series of spacecraft planned by JPL for moon landings. It involves a soft landing of an instrumented vehicle on the surface of the moon.

Ryan Electronics is involved in a number of space projects including efforts toward solving such space system problems as rendezvous terminal guidance, antisatellite terminal guidance, satellite vertical reference, gravitation control and communication antennas.

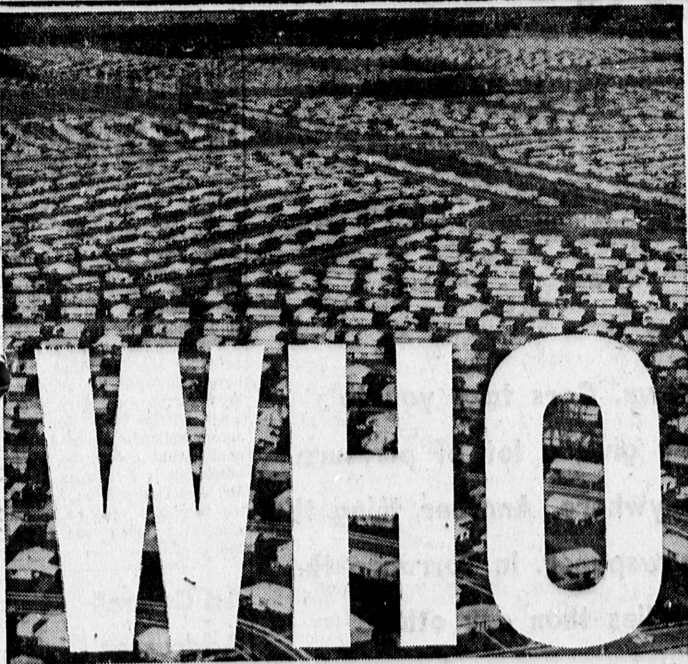
