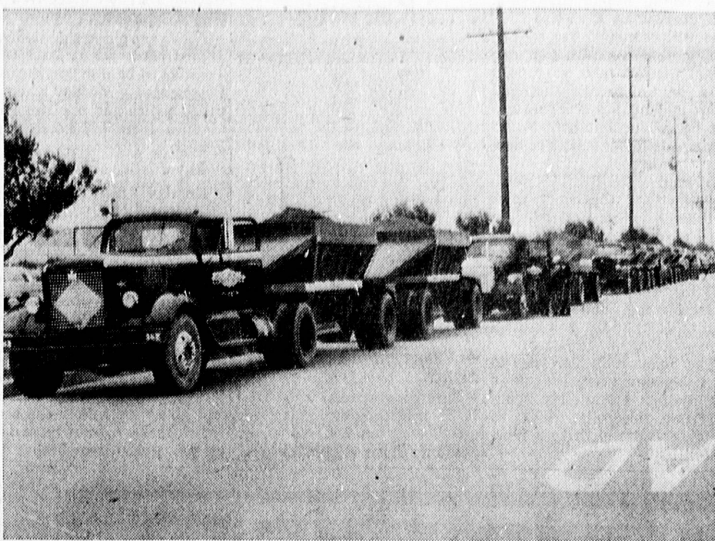

Council Keeps Promise: Cuts Tax Rate Five Cents

Promises earlier this year that a five-cent cut in city taxes would be ordered were carried out Tuesday night by the council as it formally adopted the budget for the fiscal year which began July 1.

Overriding requests of top administration that the cut be restored, the council voted to keep the cut with only George Bradford dissenting.

City Manager Wade Peebles and Finance Officer Jerome Scharfman had warned councilmen that the cut would leave reserves dangerously low in the event of heavy rains this winter, or in other emergencies.

The council also agreed to ask the county to change assessment on bomb and fallout shelters to encourage construction, but held for further study a suggestion that the city waive permit fees for such projects.

With members of the council planning to attend the annual

American Municipal Assn. convention in Seattle next week, the Aug. 29 session of the council has been canceled.
