Practice Helps Develop Good Driving Habits

Proficiency in anything requires practice, and that includes safe driving techniques. "Most drivers are quick to learn the manual part of operating a vehicle. Not as many apply that knowledge in a mature, level-headed manner, practicing every day to be a better driver," pointed out California Highway Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden.

"Observing speed limits, allowing a safe following distance, and signalling every intention to change position or direction of the vehicle are a few important indications of the practiced motorist's approach to legal, safe driving.

"On the other hand, the person who edges over the speed limit, shifts abruptly from lane to lane without warning, or 'tail-gates' the car ahead is demonstrating his lack of ability in the really skillful part of driving. He has not learned that, because accident-causing situations can arise at any moment, the wisest course is to reduce that possibility by applying every safe driving technique at his command," the commissioner said.
