Fire Class Added at Harbor JC

Orientation to Fire Service, Fire Science 10, a beginning course in the fire science curriculum will be offered in the evening division at Harbor college for the first time next semester, according to an announcement by Nicholas Zorotovich, chairman of the social science division.

The class meets Thursday or Friday evening from 6:30 to 9:30 beginning Thursday, Sept. 14. There are no prerequisites for the class.

ORIENTATION to Fire Service has been added to the fire science curriculum at the suggestion of fire chiefs in the Los Angeles area because it provides an introduction for prospective firemen to the fundamentals of fire service, fire prevention and fire insurance. Subjects covered will include fire fighting, fire company operation and procedure, hazardous materials, fire prevention, arson investigation, rescue, and fire apparatus.

Captain Donald E. Beckman, instructor in the class, is a fire captain with the Los Angeles County Fire Dept. and has 15 years of fire service experience. Beckman joined the evening staff of Harbor College in the fire science department in 1958.

REGISTRATION for evening classes at the college is by appointment. Persons wanting to attend Harbor College in the fall semester are urged to submit their applications for admission immediately in order

College Expects Big Enrollment

Despite new, more stringent admission standards, Los Angeles State College expects a record enrollment of 15,500 students for the fall semester, Registrar Vince Glenn reports. "It means that we're the second largest state college in California and by next year, we should pass first place San Jose State," said Glenn.

The figure is even more impressive considering the large number of disqualifications which had to be made of student applications unable to meet scholastic admission standards, Glenn said.

To be admitted to a state college, a high school student must have 14 A's and B's in key subjects in his high school record. Junior college transfer students require at least a B average with 24 units or 60 units with at least a C average for admission.

The new enrollment figure of 15,500 contrasts with 14,900 at LASC last spring. Number one major continues to be education with business administration and economics in second place. Engineering and science majors, reported Glenn, are showing a sharp up-trend.

College advisement and registration begins Sept. 11 with classes to start on Sept. 18.
