Temple Menorah School to Open September 17

The oldest and most complete religious school in the newest and best equipped religious school building in the South Bay will open its doors on Sunday morning, Sept. 17, for the first session of the 1961-62 Religious School year. The Religious School of Temple Menorah of the South Bay, 1101 Camino Real, Redondo Beach, will begin in the new classroom building of the new Temple structure which dominates the skyline on the borderline between Redondo Beach and Torrance.

Registration for all former students and those desiring to learn of the traditions of Judaism will take place in the new Temple on Wednesday evening, Aug. 30, at 7:30 p.m. and on Saturday, Sept. 9, at 2 p.m., according to Mrs. David Goldenberg, chairman of the Religious School committee.

A school year of 34 classrooms for classes from kindergarten through 10th grade will be under the supervision of Norman Horowitz, director of education. Horowitz is also the principal of the Alexandria Street School in Los Angeles.

CLASSES in the Hebrew department will be held on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 4 until 6:30. Six different classes will be taught under the supervision of J. Kellman and O. Abarbanel. Enrollment in Hebrew classes is automatic upon registration for Religious School. Instruction for Bar Mitzvah and Bas Mitzvah are given during mid-week Hebrew class sessions.

Assisting Mrs. Goldenberg at registration will be Mmes. Leonard Cole, Seymour Uberman, Ernest Gatzert and Mark Bennett. Also Messrs. Myer Alpert, Paul Turkheimer and Bert Belzer.

Temple Menorah is the oldest Jewish congregation serving Jews of the South Bay and Peninsula area. Affiliated with the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, this congregation was instituted by Mr. and Mrs. I. Grancell in 1947.

More than 180 youngsters came to the aid of Smokey Bear last week while attending Torrance YMCA Camp Round Meadow near Barton Flats.

Local Rangers were faced with the loss of 73,000 tiny pine trees in desperate need of water. Government personnel were not available to save the young forest.

Lester Foster, local school principal, was serving as Camp Director for the "Y" and he heard of the impending disaster. Within minutes, Foster recruited an army of eager YMCA boys; dozens of watering cans; 300 gallons of water; and transportation to the newly planted forest.

The YMCA group devoted a day of work to saving the trees. The boys trudged back and forth for over five hours in order to water each small plant.

Foster reported that this work project was one of the highlights of camp for the boys involved.

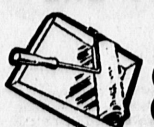

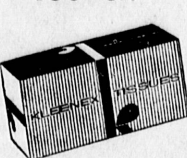

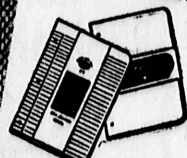
