For Rough Year

Metropolitan Conference teams, facing the toughest and most attractive schedule in conference history, open practice for the 1961 season tomorrow. First games are scheduled Sept. 22. Conference play starts Oct. 6.

The conference enters the campaign rated one of the toughest of the nation's junior college loops. L. B. Chapman of the All-America Grid Index rates three of the teams — Junior Rose Bowl champion Long Beach City College, Bakersfield and Santa Monica City College — among the nation's top 11 junior college squads. These three meet each other in the last three weeks of the season.

The lineup of head coaches is the same as last year except at San Diego Junior College, where John Kovac, 1960 assistant, moved up to take over for George Schutte. Schutte has accepted an administrative post at the school.

For North High

The 1961 football season kicks off at North High School in Torrance with physical examinations and equipment issue on tap tomorrow morning. The first practice session is slated for Saxon gridders at 1:05 on Tuesday.

Varsity candidates are asked to report at 9 p.m. tomorrow for physicals. Bee team aspirants will be processed starting at 1 in the afternoon. Junior Varsity and Cee squad members need not report until school opens on Sept. 13.

Some 55 Varsity gridders are expected to be on hand to greet coaches Bob Shoup and Ed Levy.

Jerry Nicholson, former El Camino and Long Beach State gridders joins the Saxon coaching staff this fall. Nicholson will assist with the backfield duties and Junior Varsity squad.

Only six lettermen return as a nucleus at North. Tackle Bob Martin is the only regular returning from last year's fine team that posted a 5-2-1 record.

Coach Shoup, starting his fifth year at North, looks forward to a fine season in the tough South Bay League. With good quarterbacking and end prospects, the Saxons look to take to the air. Lack of experience is the team's main weakness.


