Assemblyman Suggest Letters, Religion for Civil Defense

On the federal level, you should write to the President of the United States of America, the White House, Washington, D.C., and ask him for the following information:

• The names and addresses of buildings which will be

used as community fall-out shelters, mentioned in the fine patriotic, aggressive program of our President, who has demonstrated great courage in speeches.

• The names and addresses of buildings which are not yet equipped with fall-out shelters, but which President Kennedy intends to modify for our protection.

• The names and addresses of any and all federal buildings in California which now have, or may have later, fall-

out shelters.

• How much survival material, including food, water, first aid equipment and tools will be given by the government of the United States to our citizens after it has donated billions of dollars to communist, enemy countries. This is certainly a fair question.

• Who will make the profits from the proposed new warning system, called the national emergency alarm repeater, which will be sold to all homeowners?
