GOP Candidate For Governor Speaks Tonight

Candidate Speaks Here

Joseph C. Shell, minority leader of the California Assembly and a declared candidate for the Republican nomination for governor in 1962, will speak tonight at a meeting of the Californians for Goldwater, South Bay Chapter.

The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. at the Smith Bros. Fish Shanty, 4020 Pacific Coast Hwy. It is not a dinner meeting.

Shell has been minority leader in the Assembly and has held office since 1953. He has served on the Assembly committees on Government Organization, Industrial Relations, Manufacturing, Oil and Mining Industry and Revenue and Taxation. A graduate of USC, he received his bachelor's degree in Business Administration and entered the Navy.

The 43-year old veteran served in the Naval Air Force and is married. He and his wife have five children.

The meeting is free of charge. A no host social hour will precede the 8 p.m. meeting.
