Lyons, a veteran medical executive, as administrator of Ri-viera Community Hospital in

viera Community Hospital in Torrance was announced today. Lyons, 43, was named to succeed Dean Crowder, who has been appointed administrator of the Morningside Hospital in Inglewood by the Lutheran Hospital Assn. of Southern California. Crowder came here five months ago as interim administrator as the result of an agreement between the association and the local hospital's board of directors.

THE NEW administrator, whose appointment is effective Sept. 18, comes to Torrance from The Westwood, a psychiatric hospital in West Los Angeles, where he was administrator for two years. Previously, he held executive posts at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital, Los Angeles; Beverly Hills Doctors' Hospital and at institutions in Kansasa, Missouri, Wisconsin and Indiana.

Travel Guide Released For **Bus Patrons**

A new guide to MTA service in the Centinela Valley and South Bay area was released today by the Metropolitan Transit Authority.

The new, "Fast, Easy Way" guide was published as a prelude to the service improvements, regroupings and transfer benefits which will become effective on MTA lines operating in the area beginning Sept. 10.

Among the major improve-

Among the major Improvements will be the extension of the Hawthorne-Inglewood-Los Angeles Line 5 from Hawthorne Blvd. and Broadway, Hawthorne, 3.4 miles south to Hawthorne Blvd. and Artesia St. (South Bay Shopping Center) and the extension of the Crenshaw-Vine St. Line 85 from Crenshaw Blvd. and Manchester Ave. 3 miles south to chester Ave. 3 miles south to Crenshaw and El Segundo Blvds.

DIRECT THROUGH service to and from various other areas in the South Bay and Centinela Valley area along with later evening service are other features of the expand-

other features of the expanded program.

In addition, duplicate fares now required between the former Cross Town lines in the South Bay and Centinela Valley and regular MTA lines will be eliminated with the establishment of universal transfer privileges.

In authorizing the new universal transfer privileges and eliminating duplicate fares, a 22½-cent token fare (25-cents cash) has been established for all lines of the former Cross Town system.
The new guide contains an extensive map to aid travelers in their journeys on MTA lines throughout the Centinela Valley and South Bay area.
