

## AAUW To Hear Talk On 'Arts'

"Art at Mid-Century" will be Professor Edward Farmer's topic when he addresses the Manhattan Beach Branch of the American Association of University Women Sept. 11 at 8 p.m. The meeting will be held at the Manhattan Beach Community Church, 303 Peck Ave.

The speaker is acting executive head of the Art and Architecture Depts. at Stanford, is advisor of the Santa Clara Art Commission, and is a contributor to the National Art Shows.

Using slides to illustrate his views, Prof. Farmer will develop the idea that the artist translates the spirit of his time. He will investigate painting and architecture used as sermons, the rejection of the sentimental, the search for value in plain facts, and the finding of beauty in planes, mass and space.

Examples of the free form, psychological painting and sculpture and negative architecture, as used by Pollock, Shahan, Levine and Tanguy will also be discussed.
