MTA Begins Service to El Camino

Officials of the Metropolitan Transit Authority this week announced several improvements in services to El Camino College. The new service will be inaugurated Sept. 11, when school opens.

College service will operate Monday through Saturday on MTA's Redondo Beach-Crenshaw Blvd. Line 101.

Other improvements to be made with the Sept. 10-11 service week include the extension of the Hawthorne-Inglewood-Los Angeles line 5 to the South Bay Shopping Center, and the extension of line 85, serving Crenshaw Blvd., from Manchester Ave. to El Segundo Blvd.

Departure times and complete service schedules may be obtained from the MTA district office, or by writing to the authority at 1060 S. Broadway, Los Angeles 15.

Add Tank Cars To Linde Co. NASA Delivery

A new fleet of jumbo rail road tank cars hit the rails this week as Linde Co., division of Union Carbide Corp., began regularly scheduled coast-to-coast shipment of liquid hydrogen. Although outwardly similar to the popular jumbo car used for LPG and bulk chemicals, Linde's new rolling stock features unique inner construction—a double-walled container insulated by vacuum Super Insulation to protect its ultra-cold liquid hydrogen car go which is 423 degrees below zero.

Coast-to-coast shipping of liquid hydrogen is a part of Linde's \$31-million supply contract awarded by National Aeronautics and Space Administration last December. The company has been operating a six-ton-per-day liquid hydrogen plant in Torrance for more than a year, and is currently building a 26-ton-per-day facility at Ontario, California, to meet growing supply requirements. Linde's transport fleet will keep West Coast rocket development centers supplied with liquid hydrogen from the government's production facility at West Palm Beach, Fla., until the Ontario installation is put into operation in mid-62.

Through a combination of highly specialized engineering skills—Linde's cryogenic engineering know-how and General American Transportation Corp.'s extensive experience in tank car design and construction—the first liquid hydrogen jumbo was placed in service less than eight months after planning began. General American fabricated the outer shell and underframe at its Sharon, Penn., plant; inner tank construction, insulation final assembly and leak testing were performed at Linde's Tonawanda, N.Y., factory.

In addition to the new jumbo tank cars, Linde will utilize 3 standard, 95000-gallon tank cars converted from liquid oxygen-nitrogen service, and twelve 78000-gallon truck trailers specially designed for liquid hydrogen from the jumbo tank cars at the end of their cross-country run.
