Schedule of Homemaking Courses for Adults Set

Homemaking courses in basic sewing, dressmaking, and tailoring will be offered by the Torrance Evening High School opening Monday evening, Sept. 18. These courses have been designed to meet the needs of the individual in beginning sewing as well as for those more advanced.

Basic sewing is intended for the beginner who will be sewing for the first time, or who has been sewing for a short period. Dressmaking is offered for those who have some background in sewing and are now ready to give their attention to custom details and finishing of garments. Tailoring is intended for those who have had considerable experience in sewing and who are now ready to go into more advanced courses in sewing.

Registration for basic sewing will be held in the classroom with the teacher at 7 p.m. on Wednesday evening, Sept. 20, at North High School, and at Torrance High School on Thursday evening, Sept. 21.

Psychology of Personality in Adult Classes

Two classes in psychology of personality development will be offered this year by the Adult Education, Torrance Evening High School.

The first class will open at Torrance Evening High School on Monday evening, Sept. 18, at 7 p.m., and the second one will be held during the day, on Thursday mornings, from 9:30 to 12:30, at El Retiro Park.

Schools a Strong Influence in Sales of Peninsula Area Homes

A highly favorable school situation is one of the factors behind the rapid sales pace at Grandview Rolling Hills, says William C. FOR CATHOLIC school students, construction soon by the new St. Peter Alcantara Parish of a church and elementary school at Crenshaw Blvd. and Crest Rd. will shorten travel distances. Marymount High School and the new Marymount College campus are nearby on the peninsula.

Grandview Rolling Hills is also conveniently located close to the Peninsula Shopping Center. First unit offers a choice of three and four bedroom, dining or family room homes with inside living space from 1432 to 1816 sq. ft., in nine stylings designed by the architects for the peninsula setting. Model homes are being rushed to completion and Hawthorne Blvd., near Silver Spur, adjacent to the seven furnis-

ed models for Grandview Palos Verdes.

ALL PLANS include built-in gas range ovens, with dishwashers in most, carpeting, brick fireplaces, ash paneling, ceramic tile, ash cabinets, sliding glass doors, and landscaping of front and sides.

At Grandview Palos Verdes, some models are now available for occupancy in the Country Club Unit, which adjoins the golf course of Palos Verdes Country Club.

PRICED FROM \$29,535, and including split level stylings, they contain three and four bedrooms and family room, two and three baths, with up to 2127 sq. ft. of inside space. Trades are actively considered at this location and at West Palos Verdes Estates, community of 80 spacious residences overlooking the ocean near the intersection of Palos Verdes Dr. West and Hawthorne. These homes are priced from \$34,900 and are available to veterans on VA terms. Immediate occupancy is offered in some.
