

## School Bus Safety Program Scheduled by Adult School

The increasing need for capable and properly trained school bus drivers has become a major problem of concern for the State Dept. of Motor Vehicles, the Dept. of Safety and Health, State Dept. of Public Instruction and the local school district.

Torrance Evening High School is sponsoring a special course in "Safety Training for School Bus Drivers" on Monday evenings, beginning Sept. 18, at the Torrance Unified School District bus garage at 2340 Plaza Del Amo. Classes will run from 7 to 10 p.m. for a total of 12 hours of training. Students will register in the class with the teacher.

The course will provide training for new recruits wishing employment with school districts needing drivers and insures adequate preparation of these drivers for school bus operation. It will also offer opportunities to presently employed bus drivers to brush up on the: (1) Legal and moral responsibilities of school bus drivers; (2) Traffic rules and regulations; (3) School bus passenger management; (4) care and operation of school bus equipment; (5) General review of problems of safe driving and bus management.

John Mock, supervisor and director of the school bus program for Torrance, will conduct the course.

Design of aircraft electrical power and cooling systems which have virtually no moving parts is being studied by Douglas Aircraft Co. under terms of a \$120,000 contract announced today by the Navy.

Utilizing thermoelectric principles, the systems are to operate on waste heat from jet or rocket engines to produce both electricity and a cooling source to satisfy aircraft or missile power and electronic cooling requirements.

The 18-month research program, to be conducted by the El Segundo Division of Douglas for the Bureau of Naval Weapons, will cover investigations of heat sources and system utilization in the initial phase.

A SECOND will include design of specific thermoelectric systems to a particular aircraft.

Thermoelectric systems are based on the unique characteristics of certain semiconductor materials to heat or cool themselves when direct electrical currents are passed through them.

The material also operates in reverse cycle, generating electricity when heat is applied.

BASED ON earlier company-funded work, the Navy study will explore the potentials of venting waste exhaust heat to a thermoelectric generator to generate power for aircraft electrical systems.

Voltage from a thermoelectric generator also will be supplied to a second unit to create a low temperature source for cooling aircraft systems and cockpits.

Thermoelectric systems are potentially capable of providing aircraft power and cooling capabilities with much greater operating reliability than systems presently in use.

## Ice Follies Outing Set Next Week

Reservations may be made by calling the Recreation Dept., FA 8-5310; all reservations must be paid for by Monday, Sept. 18. Early reservation is suggested because the trip is limited.
