



Torrance Student Wins Top Chemistry Honors

Ralph M. Johnson, El Camino College pre-medical major, has been selected the outstanding general chemistry student during the last school year in national competition sponsored by the Chemical Rubber Co., William T. Moon, assistant director of instruction at El Camino, has announced.

Johnson placed first in the Far West Region, 14th annual nation-wide Achievement Award Program, sponsored by the Publications Division of the company. He will receive a Certificate of Merit from the Chemical Rubber Co., and in addition, \$100 worth of scientific books will be donated by the El Camino College library, in honor of his achievement. Each book will include a bookplate with the college name and a suitable inscription, giving credit to Johnson and the college.

Success Topic Of Toastmasters

A panel discussion on "How To Be Successful In Business" highlighted the regular South Bay Toastmaster Club 280 meeting Wednesday evening at the Elks Club, Redondo Beach.

Participants in the discussion were James Coyle, Hermosa Beach; W. Howard Smith, Torrance; Thomas Eadie, Hollywood; Riviera, and Robert Norland, El Segundo.

Robert Norland, with his speech on "Know Your Boss," was declared winner of the session. Second place was awarded to James Coyle for his humorous speech on "Marry the President's Daughter."

The impromptu table topic speech program was presented by chairman Leonard Gaines and was won by Fred Strible, Manhattan Beach.

The next South Bay Toastmaster Club 280 meeting will feature educational speeches on the very practical subject of "How To Increase Your Salary."

JOHNSON received the award by virtue of his performance on a two-hour examination conducted in May in competition with general chemistry award winners of most of the colleges and universities in the seven western states and several Canadian colleges. Johnson studied chemistry at El Camino College under instructors John McQuerry and Dr. Robert Long.

El Camino College has participated in the annual award program for five years. Johnson is the first El Camino student to place first in the annual competition, although two El Camino College students have placed in the top three places in the past. Jerry Buchholz, now a graduate student of the University of California at Berkeley, tied for second place in 1957; and Jerry Nakanson, now a naval aviator, was third in 1959.

Two Torrance Men in CHP Training Class

Torrance residents Samuel C. Rogers and Wesley D. Mather have been appointed to the California Highway Patrol and have been assigned to the Patrol's Academy in Sacramento for 12 weeks of training.

The new traffic officers will receive instruction in more than 50 subjects related to traffic law enforcement. Emphasis is placed on the California Vehicle Code, traffic supervision, accident investigation, first aid, preservation of evidence, court systems and legal procedures, and equipment operation and maintenance.

The current class is made up of 80 men from all parts of California.

Rogers formerly was a member of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Dept., and Mather formerly was a Hawthorne City police officer.
