

Study of Book Of Revelations Undertaken

Fact or fantasy? Wild imagination or the beautiful unfolding of the fight between truth and error? A compilation of scattered writings or a beautifully written piece of literature? These are some of the questions which are being studied in the new series of lessons on the Book of Revelation at Redondo Beach Church of Christ, 6122 Pacific Coast Hwy.

Dr. Warren S. Jones, teacher of the Wednesday evening class pointed out in the introductory lesson some of the basic ideas for a fuller understanding of the Book.

"There is little doubt in the minds of most scholars," Dr. Jones said, "that it is John, the apostle, who is the author of the book and was probably completed about 95 or 96 A.D." Jones pointed out in his first lecture that many pseudo-prophets find texts for each of the world events in history. Others find in it speculative ideas clearly contradicted by other passages in the Bible.

IT IS DUE to these conflicting ideas on the Apocalypse that for several years Dr. Jones has presented the book in the light of progressive parallelism. This interpretation, originated by Dr. William Hendriksen, of Grand Rapids, Mich., offers a sane approach to the Book and avoids the tangents which are made possible by other approaches.

The idea, stated briefly, is that John is revealing the fight between good and evil. He uses

symbols to tell of this fight which takes place between the birth of Christ and the second coming of Christ.

ATTENDANCE at the 7:30 Wednesday evening class continues to increase and the public is invited to attend this series of lessons, as well as all services of the church.

Dr. Jones, who is also head of the Dept. of Speech at Pepperdine College, has served the Redondo Beach Church of Christ as minister since September of last year. The local church has shown growth in every aspect of its work, having set records in the attendance and contributions in the past year.
