



## Small Colleges Saving Millions for Taxpayers

Small colleges in the United States save the taxpayer over \$50,000,000 annually, said Dr. John Martin, president of Upland College, California, at the annual Faculty Workshop at Marymount College in Palos Verdes Estates.

"If all students attending our colleges and universities were supported by public funds, the cost would be five times to the taxpayer as it is now," he adds.

Small colleges are too modest about the quality of education they provide, believes Dr. Martin. As opposed to 'assembly line methods' of large universities, he is convinced that small colleges are small enough to know each individual student, but large enough to serve all his needs.

HE CITED statistics which prove that small colleges provide 66 per cent of the nation's executives of great corporations, 75 per cent of the lead-

ers in government and 60 per cent of the judiciary.

"Small colleges can operate more economically than large educational plants, which is one of the reasons why they have increased 34 1/2 per cent in growth in the past decade, compared to a general 25 per cent. They produce a hand-made product of custom quality instead of a large factory product, but much cheaper."

MAJOR universities and colleges now can accept only one out of five qualified applicants, so it is the duty of the small college to absorb the remaining group which is searching for an education.

"Small colleges have the patience and facilities to produce diversified graduates with spiritual integrity and high moral consciousness, which is so badly needed in these trying times," he concluded.

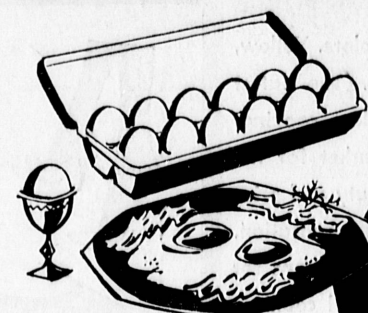
