Flight Surgeon to Speak At Women Pilots Meeting

Dr. Robert Donaldson, North American Aviation flight surgeon at the firm's Los Angeles Division, will speak Saturday night at a banquet of the International Organization of Women Pilots, better known as the Ninety-Nines.

His topic will be "Medical Problems of Supersonic Flight." Dr. Donaldson, a Santa Monica resident, is an undergraduate of Washington and Jefferson College in Washington, Pa.

He has attended the University of Pittsburgh School of

Medicine and Ohio State University School of Aviation Medicine where he received his master's degree.

The speaker spent four years as a general practitioner and studied preceptorship at Pan American World Airways in Jamaica, N.Y., before going to work for North American Aviation in 1961.

His duties at North American are the health maintenance of test and transport pilots and special examinations which have included the special testing of humans required for the X-15 flights. Dr. Donaldson is also working on the human factors involved to complete the B-70 project.

Dr. Donaldson has had many opportunities to fly with the North American Pilots in the T-39, a two engine jet aircraft which his company builds for the Navy.

Saturday night's banquet will be at 2900 Pacific Coast Hwy.
