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County Fair, Hailed Greatest Success of All, in Final Days

The curtain will ring down Sunday night (Oct. 1) on the 34th annual Los Angeles County Fair, undoubtedly one of the most successful of them all, as prospects indicate that the attendance goal of 1,200,000 will be reached by a safe margin.

That the exposition may close in a blaze of glory, the program for the remaining days is replete with special events and attractions as colorful as they are exciting.

The highlight of the finale comes Sunday afternoon at 2 with a huge parade of 17 high school and youth bands. During the afternoon there will be two free performances on the stage in front of the grandstand of "Circusana" and one show Sunday at 7 p.m., plus a continuous round of entertainment on the stage of the new amphitheatre and at the gay Mexican Village.

In the 800-foot long Palace of Agriculture, where California's agricultural and horticultural wealth, natural resources and recreational advantages are displayed by nearly 100 counties and communities, the exhibits have been refurbished with fresh fruits, flowers and vegetables from the huge refrigerator storage boxes.

More than 200 judges from all over the nation have completed their chores in their respective divisions in the more than 6000 individual competitions of the fair and the work of distributing over \$200,000 in prize money has already started.

TRUE TO expectations, the new Storybook Farm is a magnet for the vast majority of fairgoers, young or old. The Court of the Redwoods and the International Building continue to attract capacity crowds while the new amphitheatre is a mecca for visitors seeking relaxing entertainment.

Added events are planned for all areas during the closing weekend. In the Sports Plaza, Vicki Van Hook, champion water skier will perform daily on the marina and will be joined by other outstanding figures of the sports world in various demonstrations.

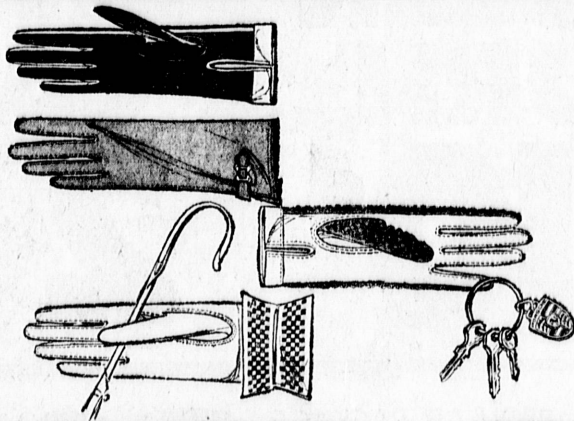
For boys in the Casimir and Lincoln School areas, Troop 219 is sponsored by the Torrance Kiwanis Club.

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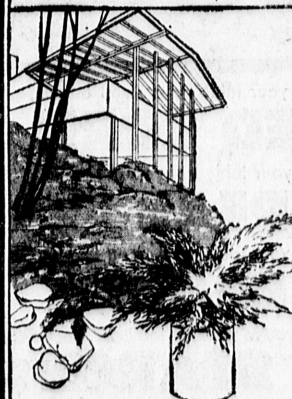

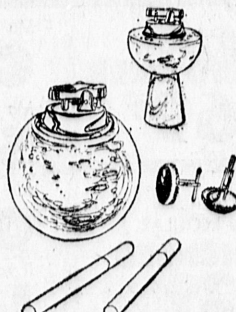

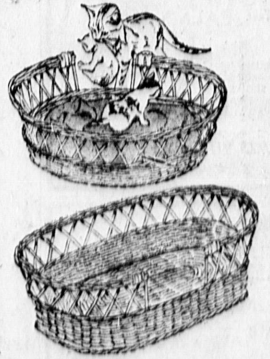
