Making debuts will be pianist Adrian Ruiz, 23, of Los Angeles; cellist Gayle Smith, 17, Glendale; baritone James Tippey, 29, Los Angeles; and composer Robert Brunner, 23, Brentwood.

Supporting them will be a 110-piece symphony orchestra assembled by the Foundation from metropolitan Los Angeles and 20 outlying communities. The orchestra will be directed by Henry Lewis, conductor of the Philharmonic's Symphonies for Youth concert series again this year.

the concert a reality for the young musicians by substantially supporting "Debut Night," and by its Music and Fine Arts Committee administering the patrons planning programs, organizing ticket sales and school programs, and gaining public support for the worthwhile cultural activity.

The concert will be in tribute to Dr. Bruno Walter of Beverly Hills, at age 85 one of the world's greatest living conductors. He will attend the concert to present one of the four \$1,000 scholarships being given by the Foundation to the winners.

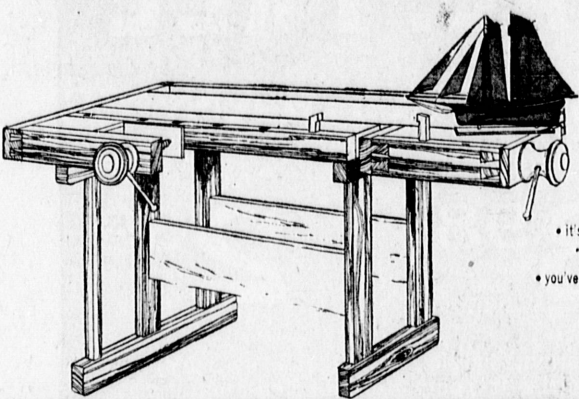

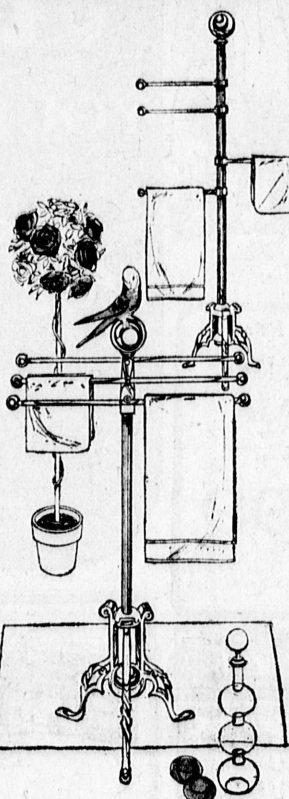

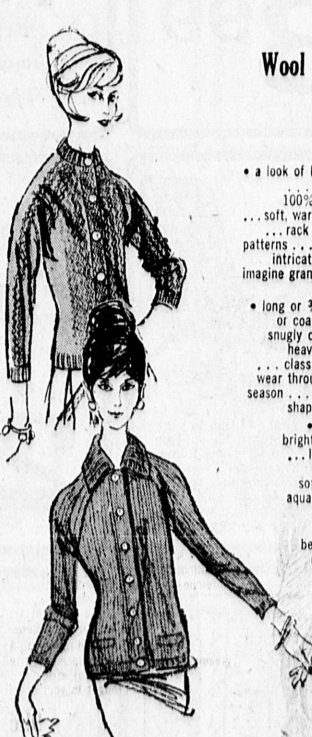
