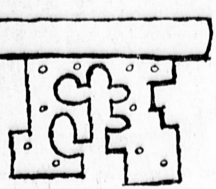

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## Emergency State Laws Relating To Fallout Shelters Advocated

New, emergency laws relating to fallout shelters should be enacted by the California State Legislature during the 1962 session, which is primarily a budget session and no bills can be enacted into law, other than budget bills, without the written consent of the governor.

However, I prophesy that Gov. Edmund G. "Pat" Brown will give his written consent during the enactment of laws relating to fallout shelters during the special session which always runs concurrently with the budget session.

**EMERGENCY LAWS** relating to fallout shelters, especially neighborhood or community fallout shelters, are urgently needed because under existing laws any city or community must form an assessment district, similar to the present street-lighting and sewer assessment districts, before proceeding to construct a city or neighborhood fallout shelter.

Legal and engineering experts tell me that the district assessment method would delay the actual construction from two to three years. Even a delay of one year is too long, according to many experts on nuclear warfare.

**SOME EXPERTS** believe that if a family builds its own fallout shelter that the family should be exempt from any part of the assessment for a neighborhood or city fallout shelter. This is a very controversial subject. I want you to write to me your opinion, sending mail to me at Post Office Box 327, Redondo Beach.

In addition, many experts believe that if a homeowner builds his own fallout shelter, he should be exempt from taxation on that portion of his property, providing that he builds an adequate, genuine fallout shelter and not merely a rumpus room, or a home fallout shelter which does not meet the requirements of the building codes, as explained below.

**BEFORE YOU** build a home fallout shelter, consult your city building inspector in writing, sending your letter to the city hall of the city where you live. If you do not live in an incorporated city, write to the Los Angeles County Building Department, 108 W. 2nd St., Los Angeles. Please do not write to me about how to build your fallout shelter, but please write to me regarding California State laws.

Do not hire an architect or contractor until you have consulted either your city building inspector or the Los Angeles County Building Department.

ment. Be very cautious about signing contracts with architects or contractors to build a fallout shelter unless you have carefully checked their reputation because some fly-by-night promoters are making a racket of this vital problem.

**WHETHER YOU** build your own fallout shelter or have it done by a contractor, you should provide for an adequate supply of uncontaminated air. For the relatively small home fallout shelter, you can have a hand-cranked device which will bring filtered air into your fallout shelter.

For a large home fallout shelter, for a fallout shelter built for your neighborhood or community, you will need oxygen-generating equipment which operates independently of the electric system which provides light, heat, and power to our homes and buildings, because the present electric systems might be damaged during an enemy attack, either by enemy bombs or by saboteurs now living in our communities.

**RAYMOND Spilman**, president of the American Society of Industrial Designers, has been reliably quoted as saying that he believes that an elaborate fallout shelter program on our part would be the cheapest way for Russia to win the cold war without firing a shot or dropping a bomb, because it would lead us into an expensive, negative economy, putting all our resources into fallout shelters without any possible return.

**ALTHOUGH I** have a B.S. degree in Engineering, and am licensed by the State of California as a professional mechanical engineer, Certificate No. 1992, dated June 30, 1948, I frankly do not know what to tell you to do.

I want you to tell me what you want me to do in Sacramento during the 1962 session. Again, I ask you to write to me at Post Office Box 327, Redondo Beach. I need your advice and guidance.
