NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed proposals for the purchase of \$1,000,000.00 par value general obligation bonds of Torrance Unified School District of Los Angeles County, California, will be received by the Board of Supervisors of said county at the place and up to the time below specified:

TIME: October 24, 1961, at 9:00 a.m.

PLACE: Office of the Board of Supervisors, Room 333, Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles 12, California.

MAILED BIDS: Board of Supervisors, County of Los Angeles, Room 333, Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles 12, California.

ISSUE: \$1,000,000.00 consisting of 1,000 bonds numbered 1 to 1,000 both inclusive of the denomination of \$1,000 each, all dated November 1, 1961 and designated "Election 1958, Series G."

MATURITIES: The bonds will mature in consecutive numerical order on November 1, in the amounts for each of the several years as follows:

SIGNATURES: At least one of the signatures to the bonds shall be manually affixed.

INTEREST: The bonds shall bear interest at a rate to be fixed upon the sale thereof but not to exceed 5% per annum, payable annually the first year and semiannually thereafter.

PAYMENT: Said bonds and the interest thereon are payable in lawful money of the United States at the office of the Treasurer of the County of Los Angeles, in the City of Los Angeles, State of California, or at any of the fiscal agencies of the County of Los Angeles, in the City of New York, State of New York, or in the City of Chicago, State of Illinois, at the option of the holders.

REGISTRATION: The bonds will be coupon bonds registrable only as to both principal and interest.

NOT CALLABLE: The bonds are not callable before maturity.

SECURITY: Said bonds are general obligations of said unified school district, payable both principal and interest from ad valorem taxes levied on the lands now in force, which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon the taxable property, except certain personal property, in said unified school district.

TERMS OF SALE: The maximum rate bid may not exceed ten percent, payable annually the first year and semiannually thereafter. The rate bid must be a multiple of 1/8 of 1%. No bidder shall bid more than one interest rate. No bond shall bear more than one interest rate.

Award: The bonds shall be sold for cash only. All bids must be accompanied by a check or cash for the bidder's offer par and accrued interest to the date of delivery. The premium, if any, and the interest rate not to exceed that specified herein, at which the bidder offers to buy said bonds. Each bidder shall state in his bid the total net interest in dollars and the average net interest rate determined thereby, which shall be considered informative only and not a part of the bid.

Highest Bidder: The bonds will be awarded to the highest responsible bidder or bidders considering the interest rate specified and the premium offered, if any. The highest bid will be determined by deducting the amount of the premium bid (if any) from the total amount of interest which would be paid from the date of sale of said bonds to the respective maturity dates thereof at the coupon rate specified in the bid and the award will be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the district. The purchaser must pay accrued interest, computed on a 360-day year basis, from the date of the bonds to the date of delivery. The cost of printing the bonds will be borne by the district.

Right of Rejection: The Board of Supervisors reserves the right in its discretion, to reject any and all bids, and to the extent not prohibited by law to waive any irregularity or informality in any bid. Prompt Award: The Board of Supervisors will take action awarding the bonds or rejecting all bids not later than twenty-six hours after the expiration of the time herein prescribed for the receipt of proposals; provided that the award may be made after the expiration of the specified time if the bidder shall not have given to said Board notice in writing of the withdrawal of such proposal.

Place of Delivery: Delivery of said bonds will be made to the successful bidder at the office of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, in the City of Los Angeles, California.

Prompt Delivery: Cancellation for Late Delivery: It is expected that said bonds will be delivered to the successful bidder within 30 days from the date of sale thereof. The successful bidder shall have the right at his option to cancel the contract of purchase if the district shall fail to execute the bonds and tender them for delivery within 60 days from the date of the sale thereof, and in such event the successful bidder shall be entitled to the return of the deposit accompanying his bid.

Form of Bid: Each bid, together with the bid envelope, shall be in a sealed envelope, addressed to the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County, with the envelope duly marked "Proposal for Torrance Unified School District Bonds".

Bid Check: A certified or cashier's check on a responsible bank or trust company in the amount of 2% of the principal amount of the bonds payable to the order of the County Treasurer, must accompany each proposal as a guaranty that the bidder, if successful, will accept and comply with the terms of his bid in accordance with the provisions of the proposal. The check accompanying any accepted proposal shall be applied on the purchase price or, if such proposal is not accepted, it shall be returned to the bidder. The check shall be caused by any act or omission of the district, and shall then be retained by the County Treasurer for the benefit of the district. The check accompanying each unaccepted proposal will be returned promptly.

Change of Exempt Status: At any time before the bonds are tendered for delivery the successful bidder may disaffirm the proposal if the interest received by private holders from bonds of the same type and character to be declared to be taxable income under present federal income tax laws, either by a ruling of the Bureau of Internal Revenue or by a decision of any federal court, or shall be declared taxable by the terms of any federal income tax law enacted subsequent to the date of this notice.

No Litigation Certificate: At the time of payment for the bonds the successful bidder shall furnish a certificate that there is no litigation pending affecting the validity of the bonds.

Legal Opinion: A copy of the legal opinion of the attorney or firm of attorneys designated by the County Treasurer to give such opinion certified by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, shall be printed on the back of each bond at the expense of the successful bidder.

Information Concerning the District: Torrance Unified School District has been acting as a unified school district since January 24, 1961. The assessed value of the taxable property in said unified school district for the fiscal year 1961-62 is \$28,822,220.00 and the estimated population of said unified school district is 102,290.
