



CELEBRATING ANNIVERSARY... One of the biggest sales in the history of the Thriftmart chain will be presented during the period of Oct. 30 through Nov. 12 in celebration of the company's 31st anniversary, it was announced yesterday by President Roger M. Lavery Sr. The chain was originally incorporated under the name of Fitzsimmons Stores, Ltd., in September 1930. Today, in addition to the 62 Thriftmarts, the company owns and operates a wholesale grocery division, a meat packing plant, delicatessen kitchen, a realty corporation and a finance company. In addition, the company owns a partnership interest in the Jersey Milk Products Co.

Lomita Street Project Voted

Allocation of \$1,600 for the improvement of 250th Street at the Pennsylvania Avenue intersection in Lomita was announced yesterday by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Work will be scheduled by the Los Angeles County Road Dept. pending completion of other portions of the current work load, he said.

The improvement will consist of extending the pavement to join recently constructed curb and gutter. In addition, a cross-gutter will be constructed across 250th Street on the west side of Pennsylvania Avenue.

"This roadway improvement project is one phase of work performed by the County Road Dept. in cooperation with property owners who constructed the curb and gutter under permit," Chace said.

Roadway benefits to be derived from the proposed project will be the improvement of drainage conditions, the reduction in maintenance costs, and increased operational efficiency.

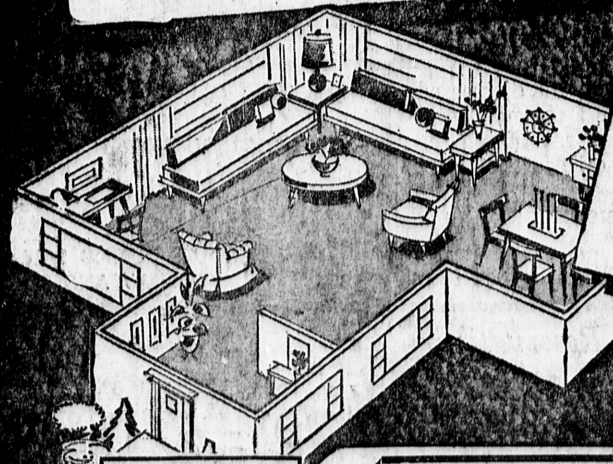
