## Magazine Representative To Address College Forum

Earl Theisen, West Coast representative for Look magazine, will keynote El Camino College's Yearbook Forum Tuesday afternoon as he challenges staff members from some 15 high schools in the surrounding area to "The Pursuit of Excellence."

Theisen, whose most recent work was published in the Sept. 18 issue of Look, as a picture story of the late Ernest Hemingway, will address the opening session of the yearbook conference at 1 p.m. in Commerce 2 on the ECC campus. Theisen will also serve as discussion leader at a photography workshop following the general meeting.

MISS NANCY BOBO, editor of El Camino's yearbook, the Warrior, is general chairman of the afternoon's activities and will act as mistress of ceremonies during the program. Dr. Stuart E. Marsee, ECC

president, will welcome the visiting high school delegates to the campus.

In addition to the workshop in photography, sessions are also scheduled in yearbook layout, headed by Gene Uht of Color-Graphic Yearbooks, Inc., and in copy preparation, led by James Powell of Mirro-Graphic Yearbooks. Visiting advisors will hold a separate session under the leadership of Don Brown, El Camino yearbook advisor and photography instructor.

**WARRIOR STAFF** members who will host the workshop sessions include Miss Lynn Worley, activities editor, in layout; Miss Beth Biller, organizational editor, in copy presenta-

tion; and Erwin Henneberger, art editor, in photography.

The final event of the program will be the awarding of a plaque for the best all-round yearbook entered in competition among the visiting schools. Two runner-up awards, one for general excellence in the use of photography and the other for excellence in page layout, will be given. Books will be judged by professionals in the yearbook field.

## County Has Less TB

Although representing a decrease of 81 new TB cases over the past year, Christmas Seal Assn. officials said today the number of new TB cases reported in Los Angeles County have now passed the 1,800 mark.

As of the end of September, 1,821 newly reported tuberculosis cases were listed on the Los Angeles County health index.

Leland A. Phillips, president of the Tuberculosis and Health Assn. of Los Angeles County, said that this figure is comparable to the 1,902 new TB cases reported in the county for the same period last year.
