To the future of the city, your Chamber of Commerce is dedicated.

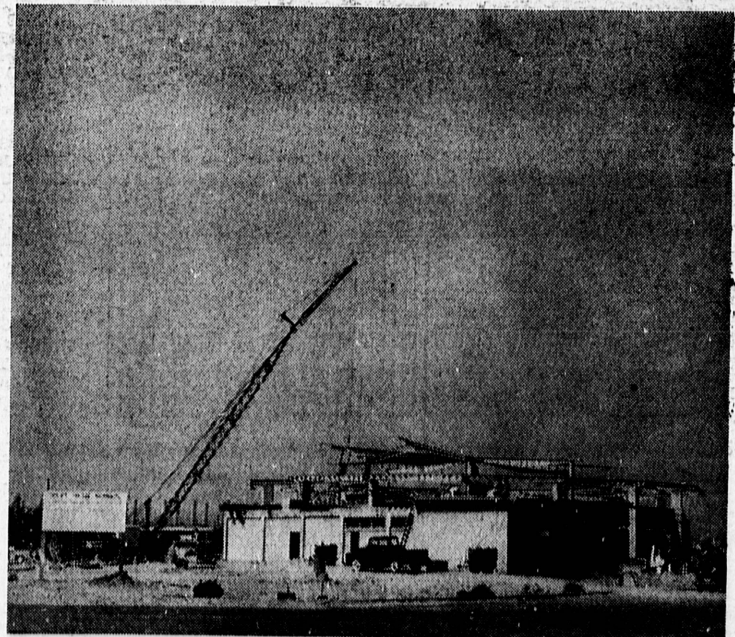
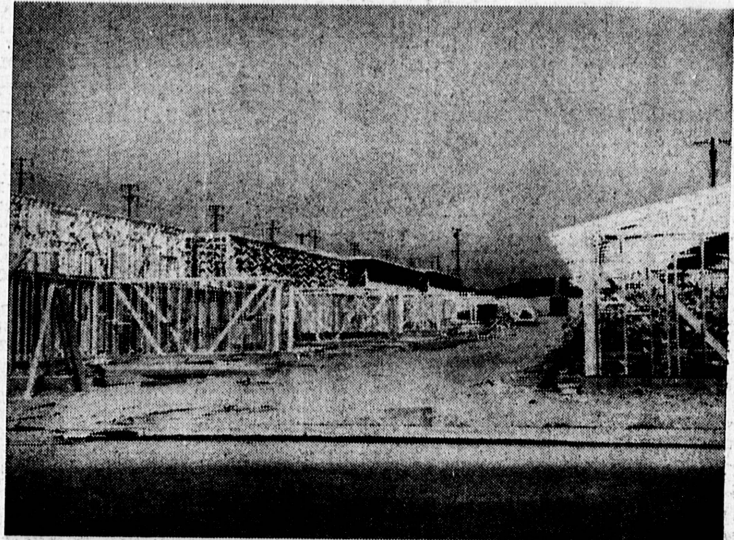
If the program here advanced is realized, Torrance can only have the bright future which the officers of your Chamber believe it is destined to achieve.
